Paving Update:

Virginia met again with Rich from A&R Daimond Paving to figure out how best to use the total funds available this year. He thinks by using asphalt on the two major serious areas, there should be enough to address broken aggregate areas on Lexington and replace the problems at the entrance to the complex by the clubhouse with real sidewalks and curbs up to the clubhouse driveway. I am now waiting on information from the tree service as to whether the best way to protect the impacted trees is we use asphalt on Continental and Huntington.

Voles:

The second person contacted indicated that voles were terribly hard to control, and he doesn't bother. He said he advised homeowners to purchase a product from Amazon that is safe and generally efficient. I discussed this with Don, and we will continue to work on the problem. I don't see any value in the costs involved with hiring the company that gave us a bid. We can do essentially the same thing with the on-site staff.

PLANNING & PROJECTS COMMITTEE

REPORT

The Planning and Projects Committee meet on Friday, March 14 at the clubhouse on the following topics:

Clubhouse Improvements

BCC Homeowners: Sue Harris, Brenda Hammack and Shelley Alpine presented clubhouse improvement ideas such as interior painting and flooring recommendations. Committee agreed that painting should be completed <u>before</u> flooring work. The 2025 budget for clubhouse improvements is \$4,300. Bids on the interior painting (includes paint, ceiling, walls, cabinets and kitchen areas) ranged from \$3,400 to \$5,500 (The lowest bid is attached, **Attachment 1**).

One homeowner asked if we could get a bid from paint contractor for painting only the ceiling, in order to stretch funds. Then maybe we can have homeowners willing to paint walls and cabinets. With this approach, it would require paint volunteers to sign a liability release form. This idea will be discussed more at the next meeting. One flooring bid came in at \$5,987 (Empire) with a few more bids expected within a week. Due to the budget limitations, it was also asked if the BCC maintenance crew might have some expertise in laying new flooring, but this would not carry a labor warranty, if any errors were made, etc.

The Committee's recommendation is to get all the bids in and present final recommendations at the next Committee meeting on April 11th. Some on the committee asked if there was any room to move the clubhouse house improvement "reserve study project" sooner than scheduled (within 5 years). Due to low reserves, the committee was informed that only in emergency cases should a reserve study project be moved sooner than scheduled.

Other ideas for locker room improvements were presented but will need to wait until reserve study projects are scheduled.

New Exterior Paint Colors, for BCC Homes

The BCC exterior home paint cycle will begin again in 2026. A sub-committee of licensed interior designers was assigned and created a new exterior home color palette for the larger P&P Committee and meeting attendees (12 people) to consider. Brenda Hammack presented the new exterior colors (4-5 body and 2-3 trim colors). After the presentation, the Committee and attendees were very verbal and in favor of the new color presented. One homeowner asked for one additional color choice for consideration. The final color palette will be presented at the next committee meeting on April 11th at 1pm in the clubhouse. In addition, a community-wide feedback session will be held on Saturday, April 12th from 10:30am to 12 noon at the clubhouse, so homeowners can see the color palettes and provide feedback to the committee. Logistics on which units to be painted first and how homeowners choose colors will discussed at the next meeting. A final presentation to the Board is targeted for April 2025.

BOARD REQUEST: The committee would like to request that the April 2025 Board meeting be held in person at the clubhouse, so that the Board can hear and visually see a formal presentation to obtain feedback, direction, and final approvals.
