News in Our Community

I'm sure most everyone knows there was a duplex fire on Huntington Circle on October 11th. With great

fortune everyone in both units got out safely and with no injuries. Even kitty, Miss Lilly, got out. The Salem Fire Department fairly quickly extinguished the fire. Neighbors in the area reported the firefighters were very responsive and wonderful. The neighbors were also very helpful in making sure every living being was safe and cared for. They pulled together to support each other. Next steps of insurance claims and future restoration and rebuilding are underway. Claims have been filed, contracts signed for work to begin. All fires produce hazardous materials so please do not enter the premises without the approval of Summit Restoration who will be doing all of the work. Estimates are that it will



take 9-12 months for clean-up, permits, engineer reports, and reconstruction. The homeowners are working through the incident and currently have accommodations. Everyone is just so grateful all are safe and unhurt.

Battlecreek's insurance policy is very good. Our policy will rebuild the damaged units to move-in quality. It covers cabinets, flooring, and includes all built-ins like the range and dishwasher. The owner's personal policy will cover washer, dryer, fridge, and their personal belongings. Summit Restoration has been contracted to do the restoration. They are a local company based in Stayton. At the emergency board meeting we learned that several homeowners have used them in the past and several others know others who have. The reviews were excellent. Sharon and Aline *

Do You Know Your Neighbors?!! Human connection is the opposite of loneliness......This last month, as you probably know, there was a fire in one of our duplexes on Huntington. Several of the neighbors

heard a boom and ran out to see what happened and see if there was anything they could do to help. Several neighbors knew the homeowners in one side of the duplex. The homeowner in the second side of the duplex was less known to neighbors. Nevertheless, a neighbor went to the door on knocked to see if they could get a response. Finally, the homeowner came to the door and was able to be walked out to a warm car. It was not known until later that this homeowner usually gets around with a wheelchair and has other significant health issues and uses medical devices. It would have been very helpful to know this much sooner. All of this is just to say, please be neighborly now and learn about some of these kinds of needs. Sometimes you are the very first responder and could be the reason for making a difference and not.

That Emergency Information Form!!! At one time some of our residents filled out that Emergency Information Form. After the fire emergency, we are reminded that knowing very important information about you and your needs is truly important. You may not have noticed that every month there is a little reminder to fill it out if you

have not and to return it to Mary Schroeder. (Yup, it's down there at the bottom of this page!!) Well, this is yet ANTOHER REQUEST to have you fill it out and send it in. This is a great time to fill out a NEW FORM and return it. Perhaps your health has changed and you now have more needs to let us know about, your outside contact person has changed, or perhaps your pet is no longer with you - (important for us to know so we don't



look for an animal who is no longer living with you) or you have a new pet we should know about. These beings are very important for us to know about also!! !! Item(s) of the Month!! Fire extinguishers: Please have fire extinguishers available in your home. They are reasonably priced and easily found at many stores including Costco, Home Depot, Lowe's, Amazon, and even Safeway, Fred Meyer, and others. These units begin around \$35 each and go up from there in price. A couple of things to remember about fire extinguishers - information obtained from Salem's Deputy Fire Chief: Once you pull the pin and use them, even just a little, they are finished. You cannot just hang them back up and think you can use them again even if you did not empty the container—when you stop the flow, the nozzle clogs and cannot be reopened. Soooo, what do you do now? Well, we asked about recharging fire extinguishers and the answer from the Deputy Fire Chief was NO. It's rare to find a place to get them recharged, and it's very expensive so you should just go get a new one. They are inexpensive enough and then you will be well prepared for your next possible need. Also check the date on your unit - if it's out of date, you also should replace it. While you're at it, get a couple!!

Fire Blanket: Another item you can have on hand in case of a fire is a "fire blanket." Keeping an Emergency Fire Blanket in your kitchen is one of the most important decisions you can make for you and your family. Hang it on the wall and all you need to do is just pull the straps to release the fire blanket, cover it over the fire, and it is instantly suffocated before getting out of control. It's so incredibly simple to use. Even children or seniors can handle it. No more heavy, messy and complicated fire extinguishers. These fire blankets can be found on Amazon for around \$10 to \$12 each - get more than one! It is recommended keeping one per person in the house. It's a one-time purchase that can save lives and thousands of \$ in damages. *

Recipe Corner!

CORN PUDDING

INGREDIENTS

- 1 12-oz. can whole kernel corn, drained
- 2 17-oz. cans cream style corn
- 5 lightly beaten eggs
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 4 Tablespoons cornstarch
- 1½ teaspoon seasoned salt
- ½ teaspoon dry mustard
- 1 teaspoon dried minced onion (more is OK-up to a Tablespoon)
- ½ cup milk (any works fine)
- ½ cup melted butter

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Preheat oven to 400°F.
- 2. **Spray or grease** a 3 qt casserole dish or 9x13 glass baking dish.
- 3. In a large bowl, combine the corn and eggs.
- 4. In a small bowl, combine the sugar, cornstarch, seasoned salt, dry mustard, and dried minced onion. Add this mixture to the corn mixture, and stir to combine.
- 5. Stir in the milk and melted butter.
- 6. Pour the mixture into the prepared dish.
- 7. Bake for 1 hour, **stirring once**, or until set and lightly browned, but still soft.
